The Internal Revenue Service has announced the timeframe for the issuance of tax rebate checks, with payment dates based upon the last two numbers of taxpayer's Social Security Numbers.

The rebates, which are part of the recent economic stimulus package passed by Congress and signed by President Bush in February, will go to most individuals and couples who had a tax liability in 2007 and who filed a return. For those receiving the rebate by Direct Deposit, those with SSNs ending in 00-20 can expect deposits on May 2; SSNs ending 21-75 on May 9; and those with SSNs ending in 76-99 on May 16.

For those receiving paper-based checks, the earliest group of taxpayers to receive disbursements will be for those with SSNs ending in 00 to 09, who should receive their rebates around the week of May 16, with subsequent groups (11-20; 21-30; 31-40, etc) to follow each week thereafter. For joint filers, the first SSN on their 2007 return will determine the rebate timeframe.

Rebates will vary from \$300 to \$600 for individuals and \$600-\$1,200 for joint filers, plus an additional \$300 per qualifying child dependent. The exact amount of the tax rebates are determined by the amount of qualifying income for tax year 2007, and there is a phase-in and phase-out structure based upon income and tax liability.

The IRS also clarified the eligibility of filers receiving Social Security, Railroad
