President Donald Trump failed to mention small businesses in his State of the Union address to Congress on Tuesday — perhaps not surprising given that the failed 2017 tax law was an irresponsible giveaway to large corporations and the wealthy that exploded the debt while doing little for Main Street businesses.

It's true there is little to brag about in the Trump Tax Law, especially when it comes to small business. Businesses for Responsible Tax Reform's [polling](#) shows the temporary 20% tax deduction small business owners received did little for small firms: 74% of small business owners said they were not able to hire new employees

due to the law, 66% said they were not able to give raises, and just 19% said the law

from the law—from 35% to 21%—to be partially rolled back to fund policies that will help small firms.
