Working with a trained tax expert can net many benefits for taxpayers, including

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for tax pros in the country

- Check the preparer's history with the Better Business Bureau
 - Taxpayers can verify an enrolled agent's status on IRS.gov
 - Taxpayers can verify a CPA's status on cpaverify.org
- Ask about fees
 - Taxpayers should avoid tax return preparers who base their fees on a percentage of the refund or who offer to deposit all or part of your refund into their financial accounts
- Be wary of preparers who claim they can get larger refunds than others
- Ask if they plan to use e-file
- Ensure the preparer signs and includes their preparer tax identification number (PTIN)
