The National Retail Federation has issued a statement urging support in Congress for inclusion of the "Integrity, Notification, and Fairness in Online Retail Marketplaces (INFORM) for Consumers Act," in the year-end congressional omnibus legislation.

The retail group's senior vice president of government relations, David French, issued this statement:

enterprises that aim to ransack retailers and sell illegally obtained merchandise for profit, endangering both employees and consumers.

The NRF says it has long supported meaningful legislation to curtail the danger and destruction caused from these criminal activities. “We applaud Congress for passing this important measure before the end of the year,” French added.

NRF has been a vocal advocate to pass legislation that helps curb the threat of organized retail crime. The trade group has led industry-wide efforts, including a successful [grassroots campaign](#), in support of both the INFORM Act and the Combatting Organized Retail Crime Act.
