the rules surrounding them are complex," the IRS said in a statement.

Answers on how taxes will be handled are possible a soon as next week. In the meantime, the IRS advised people "wait until additional guidance" is available before filing their returns.

"For taxpayers and tax preparers with questions, the best course of action is to wait for additional clarification on state payments rather than calling the IRS. We also do not recommend amending a previously filed 2022 return," the agency said.
