mandatory sentence of two years in prison for aggravated identity theft. Tedla also faces a period of supervised release, restitution and monetary penalties. A federal district court judge will determine any sentence after considering the U.S. Sentencing Guidelines and other statutory factors.

Acting Deputy Assistant Attorney General Stuart M. Goldberg of the Justice Department's Tax Division made the announcement.

IRS-Criminal Investigation and the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration (TIGTA) are investigating the case.

Trial Attorneys Mark McDonald and George Meggali of the Justice Department's Tax Division are prosecuting the case.
